In 'n radio-gesprek op Eden FM gesels dr. Willie Cilliers met Bernadette Schaap, bestuurder van George Sakekamer.

Gesprek met Pacaltsdorp Community Business Chamber



In 'n radio-gesprek op EdenFM gesels dr. Willie Cilliers met Luwyda van Pacaltsdorp Community Business Association.

In die onderhoud gesels dr. Willie oor die rol van 'n sakekamer in gemeenskappe, projekte waarby dit betrokke is en die behoefte aan 'n organisasie om kleinsakeondernemings by te staan.

Luwyda se rol in die sakekamer is om kleinsakebesighede by te staan, veral omdat daar nie besigheidspersonele is waarin sommige van die besighede in Pacaltsdorp hulle besigheid kan bedryf nie. Dit is ook belangrik om besighede te formaliseer, meen Luwyda.

"Werkloosheid neem toe en besighede maak op 'n daaglikse basis weens die huidige ekonomiese toestande toe," sê dr. Willie Cilliers. "Dit is belangrik vir entrepreneurs om uit hul dop uit te kruip en iets te begin doen."

"Jy kan die beste produk hê of diens lewer, maar as daar nie 'n mark is om jou produk te hardloop nie, help dit jou niks nie."

Govt officials in favour of dropping Covid restrictions





South Africa's health minister Joe Phaahla has recommended dropping the country's remaining coronavirus-related restrictions.

These include the wearing of masks and curbs on gathering sizes. Phaahla made those proposals following the decline in hospitalizations and reported cases, according to a statement dated 20 June. The cabinet will discuss the proposals in the coming days, he told Bloomberg.

Phaahla's comments after the minister asked provincial health authorities for their views on whether South Africa should repeal its Covid-19 regulations. It is a statutory requirement that such consultations take place before regulations are promulgated or withdrawn.

Specific restrictions which will be discussed as part of the consultations include:

1. Mask-wearing no longer needs to be in place;
2. Restrictions on gatherings are no longer necessary;
3. Entry limitations (Covid certificate) no longer need to be in place at certain venues.

Cape Town mayor Geordin Hill-Lewis has already welcomed the move to scrap restrictions and said that the decision was long overdue.

"I call on all the MECs, the national cabinet and the president to support minister Phaahla's recommendations and implement them with no further delay. This is also the case I will make at tomorrow's President's Coordinating Council (PCC) meeting.

"The country has clearly exited the fifth wave of infections. In addition to this, the rates of death and hospitalisation in the January and May waves were considerably lower than the previous ones, even

though the majority of restrictions had already been dropped."

He added that the decision to continue restricting South Africans' freedom to decide for themselves whether to wear masks and restrict their attendance at large gatherings is not rationally related to saving lives, and thus unjustified.

"The remaining restrictions also disproportionately and unfairly affect certain groups in society, including young school children and ordinary, wage-earning workers.

"While patrons of restaurants are free to unmask to enjoy a meal in comfort, for example, waiting and kitchen staff are forced to be masked for up to twelve hours at a time. Children as young as seven years old are being forcibly subjected to the discomfort of all day masking, often while school management are comfortably maskless in schools' administrative offices.

"It is time to move on from irrational Covid-19 restrictions, and from state control over private aspects of our lives in the interests of containing a disease whose threat to human life has considerably diminished."

24-year-old opened a company during lockdown



Jeandre van Derhan is the 24-year-old founder of Steelkor Steel and Pipe, a steel and pipe provider now valued at R7.5 million.

The entrepreneur launched the company in 2020 during the hard lockdown when a lot of steel

companies closed down.

Having started the business with R820, Van Derhan's first order was worth R80,000 and he made a turnover of R920,000 within the first five months of launching.

Van Derhan had no formal training in the industry and credits a lot of his business knowledge to Donald Trump.

President Cyril Ramaphosa will meet with leaders of China, Brazil, Russia and India at the BRICS Leaders' Summit this week, with the global economy set to be a major talking point among the world leaders.

Writing in his weekly letter to the public, Ramaphosa said this week's summit aims to usher in a 'new era for global development' that is more inclusive, sustainable and fair.

"Through the reform of the multilateral system, including the United Nations, and by refocusing the attention and resources of the global community on the sustainable development agenda, the BRICS group can support a sustained and equitable global recovery," he said.

The emergence of a new 'currency' in South Africa




A key insight from the 2022 Sanlam Benchmark Survey is the emergence of a new 'currency' in South Africa: post-pandemic job security.

The annual body of research into the state of retirement funds and retirees in South Africa, found that 55% of retirement fund members had experienced reduced household income as a result of Covid-19, 58% had started living frugally and cut out all luxury items, and 18.5% had accessed some sort of long-term investment.

As many as three million jobs, both blue- and white-collar, were lost in South Africa due to the Covid-19 pandemic and resultant lockdowns. The financial strain placed on the newly unemployed and the fear of job loss has taken a toll on South Africans' mental health, said Sanlam.

SA welcomes the production of COVID-19 vaccines





The South African government, local vaccine manufacturers and organised labour, have welcomed the agreement at the World Trade Organisation (WTO) that supports the production of COVID-19 vaccines in developing countries.

The agreement allows governments to authorise local manufacturers to produce vaccines or their ingredients, substances or elements and utilise processes which are covered by patents, without the permission of the patent holders during the pandemic.

South Africa and India first proposed the measures to the WTO, with the support of other developing countries during the height of the COVID-19 pandemic.

"We welcome the agreement as a solid and helpful basis to strengthen our joint efforts to develop a strong African vaccine manufacturing capacity. To scale up the production on the continent, further partnerships will be needed, including access to know-how and technologies.

Comair's exit expedites Lift's growth plans





SA's youngest airline Lift plans to grow its fleet of aircraft by up to three times by the end of 2022, in part to cater for the void left by Comair.

Lift co-founder and CEO Jonathan Ayache tells Moneyweb that although expansion has been on the cards for the airline, Comair's sudden exit from the market has expedited Lift's growth plans.

"Our expansion plans have definitely been expedited ... We're looking to increase our fleet two to three times before the end of the year.


However, he says that in order to avoid the same fate suffered by Comair, any expansion beyond that will be dictated by market demand.

"Traditionally, airlines are very focused on growing their seat capacity and hope that there's the demand when it isn't there ... We're very focused on being demand-driven as opposed to being supply-driven and [wanting] growth at all costs."
